RULES, ENTRY AND TAG FORM

ELIGIBILITY:

- 1) Open to students, including full & part-time, undergraduate/graduate/professional
- 2) Limit of two entries per artist, preferred to be completed within 2007-2008
- 3) Entries must be original works
- 4) Media accepted: any permanent material safe for public display
 - A. On-the-Wall: drawing, printmaking, photography (film & digital), painting, sculpture, digital art, or ceramic relief (designed to be mounted on a wall); dimensions cannot exceed 48" by 72"
 - B. Free-Standing: free-standing sculpture and ceramics may be accepted for this exhibit; however the Skutt Student Center reserves the right to reject a piece on the basis of its vulnerability to damage rather than its artistic merit; dimensions cannot exceed 23" by 23" by 23"

PREPARATION FOR EXHIBITION: Entries must be ready for hanging with suitable hardware in place at the time of submission. Simple and neutral framing is recommended because it does not distract from the piece. Example: for works on paper, a metal strip frame is suggested because it is minimal in its appearance and strong in its function. Also, if a mat is used, white is suggested.

- Canvases must be on stretchers with hanging wire.
- Photographs, drawings and other works on paper must be framed, behind plexiglass (clear plastic) and with hanging wire intact; no glass accepted.
- Sculpture or ceramic relief must not protrude from the wall to an extent which would cause harm to the public or the piece; it should have a secure hanging device behind; weight is not to exceed 40 lbs.

JUDGING: The juror this year is UNO art professor Barbara Simcoe. A juror is necessary to accommodate the amount of available exhibit space and to help ensure quality. The juror will award for best quality including 1st-3rd places and honorable mentions for the overall works, not based on medium.

SALES: It is encouraged that all works be for sale. However, N.F.S. (not for sale) is allowed. Pricing should reflect fair-market value.

PURCHASES FOR PERMANENT COLLECTION: Works purchased by the Skutt Student Center will be publicly displayed on a rotating basis as part of its permanent art collection and/or placed into the art loan program at a later date.

RESPONSIBILITY: The artworks will be displayed in a public area with continuous access, on the middle level of the Skutt Student Center. Normal building security will be offered. Care will be taken in handling all artwork., The University nor anyone connected to the University will assume responsibility for theft, loss, or damage from any cause. Artists are responsible for their own insurance.

TIMELINE:

SATURDAY MARCH 15*

- Work(s) and completed entry form are delivered, accepted between 12 P.M. to 4 P.M. or by appointment.
- Works and applications will be submitted to the art coordinator at the Skutt Student Center Room 211
- Submitted work(s) will be placed in art storage until jury. Artists will be contacted by phone and e-mail if their works were not selected for exhibition.

FRIDAY MARCH 28 from 6:30 P.M. to 8:30 P.M.

- The 10th Annual Creighton Student Art Exhibit officially opens with a reception held on the middle level of the Skutt Student Center with an awards presentation.
- Skutt Student Center awards and purchases will be disclosed at this time.
- Refreshments will be provided from 6:30 p.m.–8:30 p.m.

SATURDAY MARCH 29 from 12:00 P.M. to 4:00 P.M. *

- Pieces not accepted may be picked up from the art coordinator in room 211 at the Skutt Student Center between 12 P.M. to 4 P.M. Artists must present a photo I.D. to pick up their work and a release statement must be signed.
- Entries that are not accepted must be picked up by 4:00 p.m. Those works remaining after 4:00 p.m. will be considered abandoned and will become the property of the Skutt Student Center to be disposed of at its discretion.

SATURDAY, APRIL 26 from 12:00 P.M. to 4:00 P.M.

- The exhibit officially concludes.
- No accepted entry may be withdrawn before the closing date of the exhibition.
- Work that was not for sale or was not purchased (by the Skutt Student Center) must be picked up between 12 P.M. to 4 P.M. A photo I.D. must be presented when picking up work and release statement must be signed.
- Artists wishing to donate their work to the Skutt Student Center Art Collection must notify the art coordinator and fill out a deed of gift form. Please be prepared to declare a value for the item.
- All entries not picked up by 4 P.M. on Saturday will be considered abandoned and will become the property of the Skutt Student Center to be disposed of at its discretion.
