2. Contact Your Advisor.

Educational funding of approximately \$2,000 for women who have left an abusive domestic situation to attend accredited institutions full-time or part-time. No cutoff date for application. Find out if you qualify and apply at <http://www.wispinc.org>.

Destiny Solutions, Inc

Nontraditional learners enrolled in courses or programs through continuing education divisions are eligible. This is a new scholarship opportunity, with the first award of \$2,500 provided for 08-09. Talbot’s Women’s Scholarship Fund
